Students Write Stories Inspired by Study of C.S. Lewis

All 4th grade students in the Public Schools of Petoskey take part in the annual C.S. Lewis Festival by participating in a writing unit that focuses on fantasy and the famous author's works. In this instructional unit, students first learn the elements of fantasy writing. Teachers read aloud *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*, using it as an example, or mentor text, to help students understand the elements of fantasy.

The foundation believes that supplemental funding is critical to ensuring that students receive an exceptional education.

Twice each school year, once in the fall and again in the winter, the PEF awards a series of mini-grants to teachers and programs. The fall round of mini-grants will be used in all schools in the district in some of the following areas:

CTE Students Win Big at Auto Olympics

Petoskey High School's automotive students made an impressive showing among future mechanics from seven Northern Michigan high schools and ISDs during the first Auto Olympics hosted by Kirtland Community College on October 19.

The PHS automotive team took home several trophies and awards, including 1st Place team and individual trophies.

PHS student Daniel Burnett placed first in the Tool and Fastener Identification event and second in the Precision Measurement exercise to win the top Overall Individual award in the Olympics. Fellow team member Peter Kurburski won the 3rd Place Overall Individual award.

As a team, their scores in all seven Olympic events earned them the 1st Place Overall Team award. In addition to Burnett and Kurburski, Petoskey High School Automotive Instructor Adam Hausler rounded out his team with student Gavin Himebauch and Auto Shop Aide Austin Hughey.

The Olympics tested students in a wide variety of skills, from the speed at which they could change a tire to their ability to measure tiny spaces.

The six team and individual

contests included Tool and Fastener Identification, Precision Measurement, Multi-Point Inspection, Tire Mount and Balance, and a Pit-Crew Challenge.

Other teams competing were from the Traverse Bay Area ISD Career Tech Center, East Jordan High School, Tuscola CTC, COOR ISD, Wexford-Missaukee CTC and Gaylord High School.

In addition to a classroom component, PHS automotive students learn first-hand by working on cars in their auto shop. The shop operates as a professional business; customers call in and schedule service and are billed for parts only. All work is performed under the close supervision of Instructor Adam Hausler and Auto Shop Aide Austin Hughey. To schedule service, contact Hausler or Hughey at (231) 348-2193.

NOTIFICATIONS AND SMART911 PROFILE

Public Schools of Petoskey Emergency Alerts

The *BE ALERT* Emergency Notification System has received an upgrade! Please register your account today to continue to receive school closing alerts. *BE ALERT* provides accurate, immediate emergency notifications from your local public safety agency to your cell, work or home phone, via text, email or voice message. Receive notifications about emergencies that may affect your home, workplace, child's school, parents' home—anywhere in the Tri-County region of Charlevoix, Cheboygan and Emmet counties.

SYSTEM UPDATE

If you previously subscribed to *BeAlert* at the beginning of last year, we changed providers in our notification system to partner with Smart911 and our local dispatch center. The previous vendor, Everbridge, is no longer providing the service, and you would need to log into the account we created for you in the new system in order to complete the switch. To update OR create a new account, go to www.cceoem.net and click on the "*BE ALERT* & Smart911" tab and select the Alerts:Sign Up Now" option.

If you did not previously create an account, follow the form to "Sign Up Now."

If you did but did not update and wish to now, you still can. Since we transferred basic data, your email address will be recognized, but a password must be set. Please follow these steps:

- Click "Sign In" next to "Already have an account?"
- Click "Forgot User ID or Password"
- Choose "I forgot my Password" and enter your email address (your email will always be your User ID)
- Follow instructions to reset your password
- Log in and select your school system's alerts and any other information you would like to receive on the right side panel. At this time, if you'd like to participate in Smart911, you will be able to add that information.

Smart911:

When you create a Smart911 profile, you can provide important and helpful information about you and your family that can be readily available to 911 and first responders when seconds count.

This information is optional and is only accessible by 911 dispatchers when you call from a registered number.

It's helpful if each situation is first addressed at whatever level the initial action was taken, with appeals moving onto the next level "up the ladder." The intent is to initiate communication with the person most directly involved with the situation before pursuing additional help. In an effort to streamline this process, please review the following tips for communicating with school officials.

For matters involving instruction/curriculum, start here:

1. Classroom teacher
2. Principal
3. Director of Teaching & Learning
4. Superintendent
5. School Board

For matters involving athletics, start here:

1. Coach
2. Athletic Director
3. Principal
4. Superintendent
5. School Board

For matters involving student discipline, start here:

1. Classroom teacher
2. Assistant Principal
3. Principal
4. Superintendent
5. School Board

For matters involving facilities/grounds/buildings, start here:

1. Principal
2. Maintenance Director
